The First Reading is Daniel 12.1-3

'At that time Michael, the great prince, the protector of your people, shall arise. There shall be a time of anguish, such as has never occurred since nations first came into existence. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book. Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. Those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever.

The Second Reading is Hebrews 10.11-14,19-25

And every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, 'he sat down at the right hand of God', and since then has been waiting 'until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet.' For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified.

Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

The Gospel of our Lord according to Mark

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ



As he came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, 'Look, Teacher, what large stones and what large buildings!' Then Jesus asked him, 'Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down.' When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, 'Tell us, when will this be, and what will

be the sign that all these things are about to be accomplished?' Then Jesus began to say to them, 'Beware that no one leads you astray. Many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and they will lead many astray. When you hear of wars and rumours of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birth pangs. 'As for yourselves, beware; for they will hand you over to councils; and you will be beaten in synagogues; and you will stand before governors and kings because of me, as a testimony to them. And the good news must first be proclaimed to all nations. When they bring you to trial and hand you over, do not worry beforehand about what you are to say; but say whatever is given you at that time, for it is not you who speak, but the Holy Spirit.

This is the Gospel of our Lord. **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

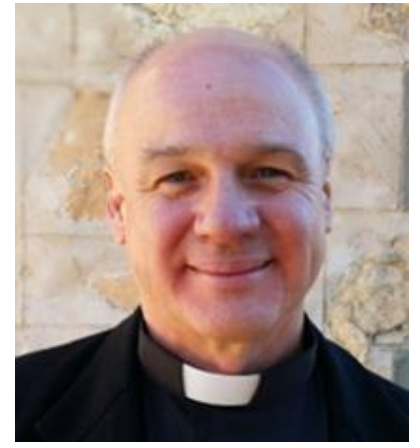

Fr Paul Writes:

Welcome you all as we come together to worship in our various churches in the Riverland today. A special welcome to those attending the St Edmund's Patronal Festival at Barmera.

I wish to thank Joy Stoeckel for overseeing the arrangements along with Deacon Scott Mudd and others for the Remembrance Day Service at the Monash Memorial Hall last Sunday. The day exceeded all expectations with some 200 people attending. The service, an idea from our last Berri Barmera Monash Ministry Group meeting blossomed to become one of the biggest events of the year in Monash. It was wonderful to have the support of the CFS, the Monash School and the Vietnam Veterans Association. It was a wonderful way for the Anglican Church in Monash to be a visible identity as part of commemorating Remembrance Day in a town named after Sir John Monash.



I want to encourage all of you to attend the second of two workshops by the Reverend John Warner in the Riverland next weekend. The workshops aim to make it a little easier for us to share our faith with others. John Warner is a gifted speaker and evangelist. He will deliver the workshops at St Alban's Berri Church Hall at 2 pm next Saturday and at St James' Waikerie after the 11 am service and lunch at around 12.30 pm on Sunday. I think anyone who had the opportunity to attend the first workshop session and/or to attend St Augustine of Hippo, Renmark where he led the service and preached would have been impressed by him. It does not matter if you missed the first workshop as he will accommodate the first timers with a good review of what was done in the first session. The Bishop has announced that he will be installed as Honorary Canon Missioner for Evangelism and Church Planting at the Cathedral on Sunday 9 December at 10 am.

The Bishop has also announced Deacon Scott Mudd will be continuing his ministry and formation in the South Coast Mission Partnership, based at Goolwa and Port Elliott. There will be a farewell Mass for Scott on Tuesday night 11 December at St James' Waikerie at 7 pm. I ask you to hold Scott and Melissa in your prayers as they prepare to undertake this relocation. We have certainly appreciated Scott's ministry with us over the past 12 months, so I encourage you to come along to the service on that night. It will be followed by a shared supper in the hall.
