Be angry but do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, and do not make room for the devil. Thieves must give up stealing; rather let them labour and work honestly with their own hands, so as to have something to share with the needy. Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only what is useful for building up, as there is need, so that your words may give grace to those who hear. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were marked with a seal for the day of redemption. Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, and be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you. Therefore, be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

There were many ideas shared but this is what was formulated by the church in Kenya, which I found reflected the Anglican Church worldwide. It emphasised an equal balance between the Bible and the sacraments, a sense of order, a holiness of God and a church committed to the culture of society.


The Australian Board of Mission, which is the national mission agency for the Anglican Church of Australia reflected strongly on these ideals and its strategic direction for the next three years. They include engaging the whole of the Anglican Church in Australia in ABM mission work, in amplifying the voice of Aboriginal people, in development work overseas and generating increased support to fund and expanding ABM's work.
